Note from the Gifted Department regarding Gifted Program Testing

The BSD Gifted Program provides self-contained services for identified gifted students needing academic services at an advanced level and accelerated pace due to their ability to comprehend and process information. Gifted children have an exceptional ability to learn or reason beyond their same-age peers. Their minds are often ahead of their physical growth, and they exhibit an unusual ability to make meaning out of complex concepts or problems.

Parents may apply for testing for possible inclusion in gifted programs for the 2016-17 school year by downloading and completing the application for gifted testing at www.bsd405.org/applyforgifted or by contacting the Gifted Programs Office at gifted.bsd405.org or 425-456-4136. **Applications are due no later than 5:00 PM on November 13, 2015.**

Any student, parent, staff or community member may refer a student to the Gifted Programs Office for gifted testing by providing the student's name, grade, school, and student number (if known) by contacting the Gifted Programs Office via email or phone at gifted@bsd.405.org or 425-456-4136. All students referred to the Gifted Programs Office will be invited to participate in testing.

Washington Administrative Code requires all school districts to implement a referral process by which students may be nominated for testing for highly capable services. Any parent, school staff or community member may refer a child. If you are interested in nominating a student for testing, please send the following information to gifted@bsd405.org no later than October 23, 2015.
