After School Activity Information

Information about after school programs will be listed below in the "**Community News**" section of the eNews. The after-school programs in the Community News section are run by outside vendors and are NOT sponsored by the PTSA. As a service to the community, the PTSA publicizes these programs in the eNews. In addition to these outside vendor-run programs, Somerset Elementary School will run some clubs before or after school which is to be determined. The school will provide information about those clubs in the near future. There are three types of after-school activities:

- 1. Those run by our PTSA: Chess Club and Math Circle. These clubs are heavily relied on parent volunteers and PTSA membership is required to register. We put those news pieces under the PTSA News section.
- 2. Those run by our teachers: to be determined by our wonderful teachers. We had Coding Club and Robotic Club last year. Teachers will send out information to the appropriate grades in the near future. If we receive info from them, we will include it in our weekly eNews under the School News section.
- 3. Those run by outside vendors: Soccer, Karate, Debate, Drama, and Basketball. All registrations and payments are handled by the vendor directly. They are not covered by our insurance. PTSA helped to bring them in based on feedback from our annual parent survey as a service to our community.
